## New Yorkers: Why is Health Information Exchange Critical to You & Your Health?



Dr. Lewis W. Marshall, Jr., Chairman of Ambulatory Care and Community Health Medicine at Brookdale Hospital and Medical Center in Brooklyn, contributed an Op-ed earlier this month in the New

York Daily News discussing the life-saving and transformative power of health information exchange.

**EXERPT:** *Imagine if you're away from home and need emergency care. But the doctors who are taking care of you don't know about your pre-existing conditions. Luckily, the Governor's budget includes funding for a statewide health information network.*

*Doctors need immediate access to a patient's health history to provide the best care—especially in life-threatening situations when a patient may be unconscious. In this case, the fastest way to get the information is through electronic health records. I know how important access to this type of network can be. Since 2007, Brookdale University Hospital and Medical Center has participated in a local health information network called the Brooklyn Health Information Exchange—one of 10 regional networks that make up New York's Statewide Health Information Network (the SHIN-NY).*

## Clinton Brings 'A' Game to HIMSS14

Speaking at the HIMSS14 Annual Conference & Exhibition early this week, Former Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton did not disappoint. Addressing a packed crowd of thousands of health IT professionals, Clinton underscored the importance of electronic health records, IT infrastructure, and why the industry needs to ditch ideologies at the door for the sake of patient care.

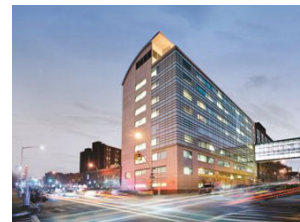
*"We are finally seeing the promise of electronic health records, leaving behind the outdated, obsolete, 20th century—in some cases 19th and 18th century—ways that records were kept,"* Clinton said.

Clinton referenced the destruction Hurricane Katrina inflicted on the Gulf Coast back in 2005, a cyclone which left millions of paper medical records destroyed. For many people, this was a huge detriment to patient care. Elderly patients, for example, as Clinton explained, often can't recall the list of medications they take, or perhaps what that little blue pill actually is called.

Maimonides Medical Center is leading the way on care coordination for seriously mentally ill patients.

Where does care coordination live? To find out, take the D train from midtown Manhattan

to the Fort Hamilton Parkway stop in Brooklyn, walk a few blocks down the area's main strip, past a sparse array of nondescript storefronts, and eventually, you'll run into the unassuming facade of Maimonides Medical Center.

It's there, within the confines of a large, 706-bed academic medical center, which from the outside blends into the southwest Brooklyn landscape, that the concepts of care coordination are alive and well. It's there that leadership has undertaken a large, collaborative project delivering coordinated care services for seriously mentally ill (SMI) populations—a notoriously hard area for healthcare providers to crack in terms of cost and care.
