Final State Budget Funds New York's Electronic Health Records System, the SHIN-NY

New Funding Will Empower Millions of NY Doctors and Patients to Take Full Charge of Their Health by Providing them with Fast and Easy Access to Their Records Anywhere in the State

Earlier this month, the New York State Legislature voted to support New York's electronic health records system—known as the Statewide Health Information Network of New York (the SHIN-NY). The final New York State Fiscal Year 2014-15 Budget includes \$55M in State funding for the SHIN-NY, which will go towards building an innovative, public network in New York designed to give doctors and patients instant access to their complete health records, anywhere and anytime. New York has been at the forefront of health innovation and will now be the first large state in the country to build a public network of interconnected electronic health records of this kind.

HEALTHeLINK Offers Surveillance Reporting Service to the New York State Department of Health



In partnership with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), HEALTHeLINK. Western New York's clinical information exchange, launched

an automated syndromic surveillance reporting service for its hospital partners. Jones Memorial Hospital in Wellsville became the first facility to submit its syndromic surveillance data to NYSDOH via this method. Syndromic surveillance data is used to detect outbreaks and monitor disease developments. This project is the result of a Health Care Efficiency and Affordability Law (HEAL)-supported initiative to enhance the Statewide Health Information Network for New York (SHIN-NY) for electronic information exchange between Regional Health Information Organizations (RHIOs) and NYSDOH.

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HIE Helps Integrate Behavioral and Physical Health Care, but Hurdles Remain



Although health care providers have long recognized that many of their patients have both behavioral and physical health needs, behavioral and physical health care have long been provided—and paid for—separately. However, in light of growing awareness of the prevalence and

cost of comorbid behavioral and physical health conditions and increased recognition of how addressing those conditions in a coordinated manner can improve outcomes and reduce costs, the health care system is increasingly embracing care delivery models that integrate behavioral and physical health care and connect providers of such care to one another.

Electronic health information exchange can help facilitate the integration of behavioral and physical health care. However, federal and state strategies are necessary to address common barriers to HIE.

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New Patient Portals Bring Mobility to HIE

Rotary phones. Walkmans. Personal health records. All items that have been relegated to the dustbin of history by new technology. Taking the place of all three, in fact, are smartphones.

Aside from making phone calls and listening to music, the ubiquitous smartphone is also a link to a consumer's healthcare information. And scores of start-ups are rushing to design the portal that enables the consumer to access that data. One of those companies is Mana Health, a New York-based startup that beat out 80 other companies to win the right to design the Empire State's patient portal. Last August, Mana Health was awarded the contract to build the patient portal for the New York eHealth Collaborative (NYeC). The company has designed a user interface to connect New Yorkers to the Statewide Health Information Network of New York (SHIN-NY), a secure network for sharing clinical patient data around the state. "It's a patient portal with the patient in mind," said Chris Bradley, Mana's CEO and co-founder, who joined executive chairman and co-founder Raj Amin to discuss the company's goals with mHealth News. "It's a one-stop shop for healthcare data."
