In a recent article, *EHR Intelligence* detailed the new strategic plan for the [Statewide Health Information Network for New York \(SHIN-NY\)](#) outlined in the [SHIN-NY 2020 Roadmap](#).

The decade-old SHIN-NY is comprised of eight regional health information networks connected together to share patient information. The ultimate vision is that the SHIN-NY will create a 360-view of a patient's health, empowering them and their care team to create a treatment plan that addresses not only an illness or injury, but underlying conditions, medical history, and social determinants of health.

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Healthix Now Exchanging Minor Data



As of October 16th, minor data will be available to providers for their patients from birth until 18 years of age—when an affirmative parent or guardian's consent is given.

The minor data exchanged will exclude SAMHSA data. For providers of minor consented services, Healthix offers a workflow which enables you to receive a one-time consent override at the time of visit from your minor patient (10 until 18 years). This one-time consent will allow you to view patient data including SAMHSA information, regardless of the original parental consent on record. Providers are expected to ensure that minor consented services and/or SAMHSA data are not available to parents or guardians unless the minor has consented to share that information with them.

NYeC Shares the Value of the SHIN-NY

On behalf of New York State Department of Health (NYS DOH), NYeC staff recently engaged with providers that play a critical role in the evolution of the [Statewide Health Information Network for New York \(SHIN-NY\)](#) and healthcare transformation efforts statewide. Specifically, the [Behavioral Health Information Technology \(BHIT\)](#) team hosted an event for behavioral health providers in Albany on October 4th. Additionally, NYeC staff co-presented with DOH leadership at the Hospice & Palliative Care Association of NYS (HPCANYS)'s Leadership Institute on October 19th. Both of these forums provided an opportunity to share information on the value of health information exchange and the SHIN-NY, available funding programs, and how HIE helps advance care coordination, fits into value-based payment arrangements, and more.

Do You Know Your 2018 Payment Status? PQRS Feedback Reports Are Now Available

CMS recently released the 2016 PQRS Feedback and QRUR Reports. The reports inform providers and practices on how they performed in quality and cost as reported via the PQRS reporting program. These reports notify a provider or group if they will be subject to a payment adjustment in 2018 for their Medicare Part B billings.

It is important that providers and practice groups access their reports because if a negative penalty adjustment is indicated, an informal review can be submitted to CMS. Informal review requests must be submitted by December 1, 2017. Payment adjustments will go into effect on January 1, 2018.

In addition to possible downward payment adjustments these reports are used to inform a providers rating on the Physician compare website, which rate providers against their peers in quality and cost performance. Both reports are accessed from a CMS EIDM account. The following links provide information on how to submit an Informal Review to CMS:

These are two separate requests. If each of your reports indicate that you will be subject to a downward adjustment you must submit separate requests for review.

Note: If you are eligible and meet the minimum requirements **you must report** at least the minimum quality data to CMS or you will automatically be assessed a **-4%** payment adjustment for all 2017 Medicare Part B claims in two years.

Recently Announced: Virtual Groups

Virtual Groups enable small group practices to affiliate and leverage their combined quality data and activities to maximize their reporting performance. The CMS deadline for MIPS Virtual Group Election Period is **December 1, 2017**.

CMS proposed a virtual group to be a combination of two or more Taxpayer Identification Numbers (TINs) made up of:

- A solo practitioner who is eligible to participate in MIPS and bills under a TIN with no other National Provider Identifiers billing under the TIN, or
- A group with 10 or fewer eligible clinicians (at least 1 must be eligible for MIPS) that joins with at least one other solo practitioner or group for a performance period of a year
